In the MEK's black and white world, departure means expulsion

The "all-or-nothing" way of thinking is one of the very destructive thinking patterns that a person can have. This thinking pattern is also called "black and white thinking". Thinking in black and white arranges the world into extremes: good and bad, yes and no.

It's like seeing only in black and white and ignoring the shades of gray in between. This thinking pattern leads the person to absolutism. Absolutism refers to ideas, phrases and words that denote totality, either in magnitude or probability. Absolutist thoughts are unqualified by nuance and overlook the complexity of a given subject.

Those who are not with us are against us!

For absolutists, there is nothing more than two possible positions. They do not admit that a person or group can have a neutral stance or could disagree in part with their position without entirely opposing them. In the cults of personality such as the Mujahedin Khalq (MEK, MKO, PMOI, Cult of Rajavi), the absolute leader is the main person to coerce members into such a thinking pattern.

In the MEK, any voice of dissent is forbidden and eventually will be silenced by any means. Based on interviews that he made with former members of the MEK, Aron Merat wrote in the Guardian that "MEK commanders systematically abused members to silence dissent and prevent defections – using torture, solitary confinement, the confiscation of assets and the segregation of families to maintain control over members".

Members of the MEK often undergo sever punishment as soon as they express their willingness to leave the group. As the former high ranking member of the group Saeed Shahsavandi told the BBC inside the MEK's ruling system "people do not leave the group, but they are expelled from the group". According to Shahsavandi, the organization do not tolerate any criticism. "Criticism and polyphonic ideas are not tolerated, so the dissident member is considered as traitor," he says. "In such organizations, relationships are based on zero or one hundred, black or white, you are either a servant or a traitor."

Absolutism of the MEK leaders explains why families of the MEK members are called mercenaries of the Iranian government just because they ask the international human rights bodies to aid them contact their children who are kept like hostages in the MEK.

As absolute powers of their ruling system, dictators suffer such personal disorder. Lack of balanced thinking make the MEK leaders fail to bring together the dichotomy of both positive and negative qualities of a phenomenon. Like other totalitarian leaders such as Stalin or Hitler, Massoud Rajavi is considered as a narcissistic personality. Narcissism is one of the popular causes of the all or nothing way of thinking. A Narcissist devalues people, considers them worthless and thinks highly of them. Therefore his mind gradually adopts the all or nothing thinking. The narcissist thinks that things are either perfect or imperfect. Massoud Rajavi calls members as "unique gems" or "freedom fighters" as far as they obey his absolute power. As soon as a member decides to leave the group, he is labeled a "traitor" or "agent of the Iranian Intelligence".

The duality of black and white thinking prevent the MEK leaders from realizing the truth because in reality most things can be approached from multiple perspectives. The fictional black and white world that the Rajavis have built inside their cult has a very destructive effect on the members' lives. They are hardly ever capable of leaving the group in a normal process. There is an urgent need of human rights bodies to aid the release of the group members from the bars of the Cult of Rajavi.

Iran International TV interview with Massoud Khodabandeh

Iran International TV ran an interview with <u>Massoud Khoda-bandeh</u> about the rumour that <u>France would be deporting Mar-yam Rajavi</u> to Albania.

Khodabandeh explained that a false Tweet about this issue was sent from a hijacked official account. But the news is true and for the past year the MEK has been severely curtailed in France and elsewhere in Europe – the Villepinte rally was banned and demonstrations have been curtailed throughout Europe (MEK gatecrashed other demonstrations just to stay visible). They will eventually be deported to Albania, said Khodabandeh.

The false Tweet was either done by the far right in Iran or the far right in the West with the help of MEK. The purpose is to prevent rapprochement between France and Iran on the issue of cooperation over dealing with terrorist organisations.

Khodabandeh explained that the <u>MEK had been brought to Alba-</u> <u>nia to be deradicalized</u> and detoxified. But the Trump administration changed this plan. By doing so, the far right on both sides rescued the MEK. But now it has come to the point that they will have to get rid of the MEK because there is irrefutable evidence that MEK have been fabricating misinformation against Iranian diplomats and creating false flag ops in Europe – in particular the Villepinte bomb plot in 2017 and similar activities in Albania, Belgium and the Netherlands.

These expose MEK as being actively involved in illegal activities, including murder and kidnapping. The security services in Europe are now working to get rid of MEK.

MEK AND ISIS ALTERNATIVES FOR IRAN?

Tom O'Connor writing for Newsweek highlighted the danger that the protests in Iran could be <u>exploited by groups like ISIS</u>, separatists and foreign governments which seek to damage Iran and even bring about regime change.

This has led to concern among analysts and activists that as unlikely as it seems, ISIS and other groups could be in a position to exploit this vacuum. This includes the MEK which is supported by senior figures in America.

The article concludes: "All three experts interviewed by Newsweek said they believed the collapse of the Iranian government was unlikely in the near future, despite the "maximum pressure" campaign by the U.S. against it.

Even for Washington, this may not necessarily be a bad thing: It has repeatedly learned that an enemy government's loss of control often had far-reaching repercussions in the form of mass refugee flows, the formation of new, more powerful enemies, and costly military interventions to fight them.

"The fall of Iran—a nation whose population is higher than all three of those war-torn nations combined—would likely have even more devastating side effects and give ISIS and other underground forces new room to operate."
